Orange Shirt Day - September 29

Three years ago, Williams Lake, British Columbia hosted a memorial event for the St. Joseph Mission (SJM) School. Former students were given a chance to share their memories from their time at residential schools, and the community took a step toward reconciliation by acknowledging and honouring their experiences.

One student, Phyllis, told a story of having her brand new orange shirt taken away on her first day of residential school. The poignancy of her tale has inspired schools in British Columbia, and across Canada, to put on orange shirts of their own to celebrate reconciliation in their own communities. **Orange Shirt Day happens this year on September 29**, and is an opportunity for teachers, students, parents, and other community members to wear an orange shirt and open up a discussion on all aspects of residential schools.



Milk Cards

Milk Cards are now available for purchase! The cost for a milk card is \$10 dollars for 10 milks. Milk will be available for students starting Wednesday, September 13th and milk cards will expire June 2018.

Student Medication and Medical Concerns

If a parent/guardian requests that their child be administered medication while at school, he/she must complete a "Medication/Personal Care Request and Authorization" form. The completed form and medication should be brought to the school's main office. This form needs to be completed for every change in medication and dosage. Non-prescription drugs such as acetaminophen, cold remedies and inhalants may not be administered to students without the signed consent forms.

If your child has a dangerous anaphylactic allergy to a particular substance, parents/guardians must complete an "Emergency Anaphylactic Allergy Alert" form. Parents/guardians are advised that the preferred location for the storage of Epi-pens and inhalers is in fanny packs worn by the student. If parents prefer that Epi-pens and/or inhalers be located in alternate locations, they must specify this on the form and sign the request. For the well-being of students, Elk Island Public Schools requires parents to complete medical forms on an ANNUAL basis and for every change in medication and dosage. If you require a form for medication, allergy alerts, or anaphylaxis please contact Mrs. Shrimpton in the office to have one sent home with your son/daughter.

Lunch Information



Elementary students in Grades 1 to 6 eat lunch in their classroom with lunch supervisors provided. Each classroom has a microwave for students to use. Due to the high demand on our microwaves and the limited time in which to warm up lunch items, we would appreciate it if all items are cooked at home therefore only needing a short warm-up. Grades 7 and 8 students will eat their lunch in classrooms upstairs while Grade 9's eat in the gathering area. They are also provided with microwaves for quick heat ups. Please note: The school does not supply utensils, so please send all required forks and spoons.

Lakeland is "Nut-Aware"

In an attempt to make our school environment safe for all students, staff and visitors, Lakeland Ridge has a "Nut-Aware" strategy. Lakeland would appreciate your help to maintain a safe community by keeping, all nuts and nut products out of school lunches, snacks, and birthday treats ect. This includes peanuts, walnuts, cashews, almonds and all other tree nuts. Please read all food product labels carefully. We appreciate your help to make the school safe for every student. Lakeland has many students who suffer from severe nut allergies. Even trace amounts of a problem food can cause a life threatening anaphylactic reaction. As part of our nut aware strategy and in accordance with EIPS Administrative Procedures, there are procedures in place for life threatening allergies including - an individual medical plan, communication plans for staff, staff training and emergency response procedure.

Parents/Relative Visiting During School Hours

ALL parents and/or relatives who volunteer or visit in the building or on the grounds are required to check in at the office (and pick up an ID tag) before going to your child's classroom or activity. We make this request for the safety and well-being of all of our students. Our staff and children need to know that every adult in our facility and on the grounds is someone that they can trust. Thank you for your cooperation.

Volunteers in Schools

With a responsibility of protecting all of the students in its care, Elk Island Public Schools has a volunteer procedure which states that all volunteers, regardless of scope, will be required to annually sign a form including a declaration that they do not have a criminal record or a child welfare record, as well as agreeing to a confidentiality undertaking. Volunteers who have an increased level of personal contact with students, such as a coach or supervisor on an extended (overnight) field trip will also be required to complete an application form and provide the results of a criminal record check. The fee for the criminal record check is waived for all EIPS' volunteers. EIPS values and appreciates the efforts of all volunteers.

Friendly Reminder to Parents

Please ensure that your child knows where he or she is to go at the end of the day and how they are to get there (bus, walk, being picked up). A good way to help your child with this information is to put a note in the agenda. This lets your child know where to go, and also helps teachers and other staff members ensure your child is going to the right place at the end of the day. Thank you for helping us keep your child safe. In some cases, parents are phoning the school daily to have messages passed along to students, but this too can cause undue anxiety for children as they

wait for word from parents. As the school office is a very hectic place, especially at the beginning and end of the day, a child will not receive the message. This could mean your child is in an unsupervised and possibly unsafe situation after school.

No Child Without

In our ongoing effort to provide safe and caring schools for our students, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) has completed its registration in the *No Child Without* program and all eligible schools, including Lakeland Ridge, are now enrolled. *No Child Without* is a joint program of the Canadian MedicAlert Foundation and the Lions Club of Canada. Through this program, registered children receive 24-hour MedicAlert coverage free of charge between their fourth and fourteenth birthdays. *No Child Without* waives all initial registration fees and ongoing membership costs during these years.

If your child has a serious medical condition or allergy and would benefit from MedicAlert services, please contact the school to obtain a program information pamphlet. You can then enroll in *No Child Without* by calling 1-877-282-5378 or online at www.nochildwithout.ca. If your child is already registered with MedicAlert and you would like to enroll specifically in the *No Child Without* program, you must sign up by telephone at the number above.

Pay School Fees Online!

School fee information for the 2017-18 school year is expected to be posted on the PowerSchool Parent Portal by early October. All fees are due within 30 days of being posted. To access your fee information, simply log in to the [PowerSchool Parent Portal](#) and go to "Student Fees." There you can view your fees and pay them online using Visa, MasterCard or INTERAC Online—when available from your financial institution.

Don't forget to log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal regularly throughout the year. Fees are often added to your child's account to cover the cost of various school activities such as field trips, class projects, athletic-team fees and more. If circumstances exist where you are unable to pay your students fees you can apply to have [fees waived](#) by submitting an [Application for a Waiver of Fees](#). Quick Facts: EIPS buses are all equipped with video surveillance

Did you know each EIPS bus is equipped with video surveillance? The video surveillance and equipment helps:

- ensure the safety of all students, drivers and property; and
- deter from destructive acts.

On a regular basis, EIPS Student Transportation reviews the video recordings, in accordance with the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (FOIP). The recordings assist the department with monitoring student and driver conduct, and may be used as evidence in a disciplinary matter.

Enhancing literacy and numeracy

As part of Elk Island Public Schools' (EIPS) ongoing efforts to enhance the literacy and numeracy of students in all grade levels, the Division is once again planning to administer two assessment tools during the 2017-18 school year—STAR 360 and Math Intervention/Programming Instrument (MIPI). The tools focus on literacy and numeracy, are digitally based and offer an opportunity for students to demonstrate their learning. The goal: to provide timely information to teachers, help enhance classroom instruction and ensure student learning needs are identified.

In September and May, EIPS students in grades 2 through 12 will complete the STAR 360 assessment, which evaluates reading comprehension. Grade 1 students will take the STAR 360 exam in October. The assessment takes approximately 20 minutes and can be taken on any digital device. Also in September, students in grades 2 through 10 will complete the MIPI assessment, which is a mathematic screening tool used to inform teachers about a student's math skills. For students in grades 7 through 10, the MIPI takes approximately 50 minutes and for students in grades 2 through 6 it takes approximately 20 minutes. The results of each offers the teacher a clearer picture about a student's learning needs and helps determine if subsequent instructional planning is required.

The scores of the assessments are not used towards a student's grade and there is no need to study ahead of time. They simply provide the teacher with information to better understand where each student is in terms of reading comprehension and mathematic ability. If, after analyzing the results, it's determined a student can benefit from extra support, the teacher will contact the family to discuss possible support strategies.

SC members will elect the executive: Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer and Secretary. Please note that both Annette Hubick (chair) and Toni Januario (treasurer) will both not be letting their names stand for election. We thank both Annette and Toni for their many years of service on the SC executive.

All parents/guardians of LLR students are automatically members of the council, can attend meetings and participate in the election as candidates and voters. If you are interested in serving on the executive (or have any questions about what the roles entail), please contact Principal Marshall. If you don't state your intentions in advance, no worries; you can still be nominated (either by yourself or someone else) at the meeting.

All SC meeting agendas and minutes are posted on the school's website under Parent Info/School Council. So what happens at School Council meetings? Here are a few examples:

- Parent input and feedback opportunities on a variety of topics at the school and division level.
- Presentations on Accountability Pillar results (how did LLR perform in comparison to other schools in the division and the province?), the school's education plan and budget.
- Reports on staffing or programming changes, plans for class sizes, etc.
- Information about school activities (Leader in Me initiatives, what happened at a staff PD day, when are events like parent/teacher conferences, concerts, celebrations, etc.)
- A report from our EIPS trustee liaison
- Discussion about an issue of concern or interest such as the timetable, the temperature in the portables, parent communication, etc.

In all cases, attendees have the opportunity to ask questions and provide input. Essentially, these meetings are an opportunity for dialogue about your kids' school community and education system.

If meetings and/or executive roles aren't your thing, you can still support your school council in other ways such as organizing or volunteering for a SC initiative. Past examples include parent seminars and the staff appreciation BBQ. Perhaps you'd like to organize a "school

spirit/community building” event? From time to time, we are also asked by school or division administration to poll parents on an issue and your response is appreciated.
