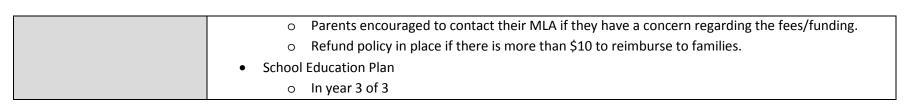

- Classroom Improvement Funding (CIF) from the provincial government
 - o Approx. \$63,898 to be used for numeracy and literacy professional development as well as materials and non-capital expenses.
