Pre - Enrollment and Request to Attend A Non-Designated School

Effective for the 2018-19 school year, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) is changing the way in which students apply to attend a non-designated school. From March 1 to 15, 2018, parents of all EIPS students are being asked to pre-enrol their children online and indicate whether their child will be attending their designated school or if they wish to register at a different school. Acceptance at a non-designated school is based on available space—families will be advised of the outcome by April 13, 2018. Because of high enrolment numbers, some schools won't be accepting any non-designated students. Schools with closed boundaries will be identified prior to the pre-enrolment process.

Please note that should you request a non-designated school for your child and need busing, there are fees associated with this choice. Visit Transportation Services for more information.

As part of the pre-enrolment process, parents are also asked to check and update phone numbers, email addresses, mailing address and other important data – doing so will both make sure that the Division has the most current information available and eliminate the need to fill in the paper Correction Form that has traditionally been sent home every fall. Better yet, families will be able to go online and update their child's data throughout the year as circumstances change.

To determine your child's designated school, please check EIPS school boundary maps.

Pre-Enrolment Process Report

The Board received for information a report regarding the pre-enrolment and data-validation process launching in the New Year. The Division is replacing its Boundary Exemption Request Process with a new online process. Annually, all EIPS families will pre-enrol their child for the following year. Each student will have the option to enrol at their designated school or select a non-designated school they want to attend - approval to attend a non-designated school is based on space. The process also requires users to verify all the student's information on file, such as addresses and contact information. The goal: Improve planning for both EIPS families and schools administration. The pre-enrolment and data-validation process for the 2018-19 school year takes place March 1-15.

Counsellor's Corner

Self-esteem is the value we place on our own qualities. It is an important part of how individuals see themselves. Self-esteem starts developing when we are babies and toddlers. Changes in self-esteem occur from day-to-day and year-to-year based on many different factors. Having a healthy self-esteem helps children and teenagers face the challenges in their world. This helps them with academics, peer relationships, and in extra-curricular activities. Lower self-esteem can result in anxiety, frustration, and a defeatist attitude such as "I'm no good" or "I can't do it so I may as well not even try".

Here are some good reminders on building your child's self-esteem. These have a positive impact on your relationship and connection with your child, which continues to enhance their feelings of self-esteem.

- Have reasonable expectations. Begin with the end in mind by helping to set reasonable goals. Provide positive feedback to continue to encourage movement towards the goal.
- Be careful what you say and use positive phrases such as "I'm so proud of you" or "You
 are creative". Positively reward effort and completion instead of outcome. Show how
 much you love them just for who they are.
- Have discussions with your child about their thoughts about themselves. Identify negative beliefs and help them to be more realistic in evaluating themselves.
- Give your child responsibility and guide them through their choices.

Parent/Teacher Conferences - February 21 & 22, 2018

Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held on Wednesday, February 21 and Thursday, February 22 from 4:15pm to 7:51pm.

<u>Elementary</u> (Kindergarten to Grade 6) interviews will be one-on-one with your child's teacher. Interviews are scheduled for 12 minutes each.

<u>Junior High</u> interviews will occur in the Kona gymnasium and are scheduled for 6 minutes each.

**All interviews will be teacher-led and it will be up to the parent whether they want their child to attend or not.

We use an online booking system and parent(s)/guardian(s) are able to schedule their own interviews at a time that is convenient for them. The website is www.schoolinterviews.ca. Our event code for both elementary and junior high is shveq and the booking site will open on Monday, February 5 at 4:00pm and close on Tuesday, February 20 at 4:00pm.

Inclement Weather

With the winter season well underway, we want to remind parents to dress children appropriately for the weather when getting ready for school or the bus. The weather often changes unexpectedly throughout the day, so please select suitable outerwear and ensure your child is prepared for changing conditions.

If inclement weather conditions occur, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) will advise parents of any bus cancellations using various communications tools including: automated-telephone messages, alerts posted on www.eips.ca and school websites, Twitter, Facebook, local radio stations, and on Versatrans My Stop.

Decisions regarding bus cancellations are guided by EIPS administrative procedures that states: "school bus service may be suspended when...Environment Canada reports a temperature of -40 C." Other reasons for suspending or delaying school bus services include adverse weather and poor road condition.

When school bus services are suspended, schools will remain open to students. EIPS believes parents have the right and responsibility to make choices for their children based on their beliefs and perceptions of safety during times of inclement weather.

Kindergarten Registration began January 15!

Is your child turning five on or before Dec. 31, 2018? If so, it's time to register for kindergarten. Kindergarten registration opens for the 2018-19 school year on Jan. 15, 2018. To register, simply complete the online registration form at www.eips.ca/kindergarten.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION CHECK LIST:

- Determine your child's designated school
- Scan and upload all required documents: proof of name, residence, date of birth and citizenship.
- Additional documents to scan, if applicable include: Guardian Letter and Parental Custody Agreement if restrictions on access.
- Once the online registration is complete and submitted, a confirmation notice is sent to the given email address.

NOTE: The online registration form is available as of Jan.15, 2018—the paper version no longer exists.

To help families prepare, Elk Island Public Schools has put together an online toolkit to make the transition as smooth as possible. The kit includes information on registration, important dates, programming options, what to expect, eligibility, how to find your designated school, transportation and more.
