b. Teacher's Report

Welcome Chantelle Robertson. Ms. Robertson presented the following report:

1. Bullying Awareness and Prevention Week

- There are several things going on all week. Thank you to our school counsellor, Chantal Harry and our Leadership 9 students for organizing the events. Some examples include:
 - Using the Seven Sacred Teachings (humility, honest, truth, respect, courage, love and wisdom) as a springboard for classroom discussions and daily announcements.
 - Jr High students have been writing compliments on sticky notes and adding them to bulletin boards throughout the school and our elementary students are working on a "chain of compliments" with words of encouragement and positive messages.
 - Students have been viewing topic related readings and videos such as Malala's Magic Pencil which focuses on bravery and making the world a better place.

2. Strathcona Food Bank Drive - November 16-25

- We have partnered with Sherwood Ford to collect donations on behalf of the food. Collection bins are located under the Cash 4 Care bulletin board by the water fountain in the front foyer. Sherwood Ford will be providing prizes for students. The draw will occur after November 25. The grand prize is 2 tickets to an Edmonton Oiler's home game. Each student who donates receives an entry for the draw.

c. Administrative Report

1. AHS Outbreak Status Update

- Many school divisions in Alberta are currently reporting high levels of student and staff absence because of illness.
- A respiratory illness outbreak was declared on November 3 at Lakeland Ridge School. We are Outbreak until Friday, November 18. At that time, AHS may lift the outbreak or extend it.
- The student illness percentages from October 31-November 15 are as follows:

- EIPS has been communicating with families about the high level of illnesses. Pending specific guidance from Alberta’s Chief Medical Officer of Health, EIPS follows Alberta Health Service’s (AHS) [Guide for Outbreak Prevention and Control in Schools](#). The measures include:
 - reporting to AHS any student absences of 10 per cent or greater
 - communicating to families when AHS declares an outbreak at a school
 - encouraging good hand hygiene, such as ongoing handwashing / hand sanitizer
 - promoting respiratory etiquette (covering coughs and sneezes with an elbow or tissue)
 - ensuring frequent cleaning and disinfection of high-touch surfaces
 - asking staff and students to stay home when sick
 - limiting large-scale gatherings in schools with a declared illness outbreak

2. Parent/Teacher/Student Conferences – Took place October 25 and 26.

3. Report Cards will be published on Friday, November 25. Both Elementary and Junior High report cards will be on PowerSchool.

4. Christmas Concerts

- Kindergarten – Friday, December 9 1:30-3:30pm at LLR in Kona Gym for Groups A & B. Group B students attend school as regularly scheduled, while Group A students will come to school for a 1:15 drop off.
 - Musical portion where the kindergarten students will perform. The performance will be followed by crafts and snacks in the gym!
- Grades 1-6 at The Park Church
 - Lakeland Ridge School will be once again hosting a Christmas concert this year. Due to the pandemic the last few years, we have been unable to bring everyone together. We will be having an afternoon concert at 1:00pm and an evening concert at 7:00pm. In the past, we have restricted the number of tickets students could have for the event. This year, we are not doing this. Our hope is that we should have enough seating from everyone. Families are encouraged to attend the afternoon concert, if possible, as this will take some of the pressure off seating for the evening performance. We will once again be raffling off “Best Seats in the House”. More information to follow. We will also be collecting donations (completely optional) at the door of the auditorium. Half the money will go to the school (to assist with bussing costs) and the other half will be donated to the Strathcona Food Bank. More information to follow.

5. Junior High Athletics Update

- Many volleyball games have been postponed due to several schools on Outbreak.
- We are working with other schools to reschedule games, but it will largely depend on whether individual schools remain on Outbreak status.

6. EIPS will host a **Student Voice** for grades 5, 8 and 11 students and volunteer parents to gather perspectives on Student and Parent Engagement as well as Diversity and Inclusion.
