- New draft curriculum for junior highs was discussed with focus on Grade 7 improvements
- PowerSchool data breach was discussed and noted it wasn't just EIPS that was affected
 - Breach did not include credit card information
 - A full report was expected on January 17 from PowerSchool.
- ASCA AGM is scheduled for April 27th for half day via virtual platform;
- School council engagement grant will accept applications until the end of June
- AB Education is reviewing their funding model for 2025-26

School Fees:
